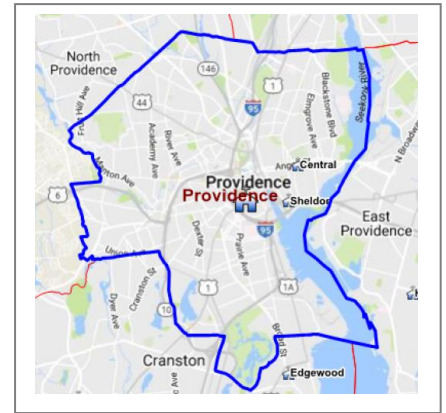

P60 <b>Cultural Connections - Striving Forward</b>	16,077	24.8%	Overwhelmingly Hispanic, nearly 70% of the household heads are of Mexican origin. The adults are generally between the ages of 35 and 50, and the households contain a mix of singles and couples with children; nearly 55% are single-parent families and more than 40% are couples with children. Job types are about evenly divided between blue-collar work and service-sector industries, typically in construction, manufacturing and food services.					
R66 <b>Aspirational Fusion - Dare to Dream</b>	8,720	13.5%	Young people on limited incomes, typically living in downscale city apartments. Nearly nine out of ten households contain unmarried singles, single parents and cohabitating couples with children, a rate about double the national average. Predominantly white with an above-average presence of Hispanics. Most adults work in low-level sales and service-sector jobs in health care, food services and manufacturing. A high percentage is unemployed.					
I32 <b>Family Union - Steadfast Conventionalists</b>	5,206	8.0%	Predominantly Hispanic families, representing a mix of immigrants and first-generation Americans from Mexico, Cuba and Central America. Most household heads are between 35 and 65, their children tending to be school-aged. With modest educational achievement levels - half the household heads haven't finished high school - they typically work at blue-collar and service-sector jobs. Most families speak Spanish, with some English at home and in the marketplace.					
O53 <b>Singles &amp; Starters - Colleges and Cafes</b>	4,661	7.2%	Concentrated in college towns, typically recent alumni or the support staff who work at the schools. Nearly half are under 35 years old and a high percentage hold either bachelor's or graduate degrees. Working in decent-paying jobs in professional or technical fields or entry-level support positions in the service sector, especially in food services. Predominantly white with an above-average presence of Asians, eight in ten households contain unmarried singles.					
O54 <b>Singles &amp; Starters - Striving Single Scene</b>	3,873	6.0%	Young and unattached, living in city apartments, with the highest concentration of singles (95%). Over 90% are younger than 35. Almost as many are never-married singles without children. Significant concentration of minorities, with high rates of Asians and African-Americans. They tend to be well-educated, with nearly 75% having gone to college, working in entry-level jobs in sales, construction, public administration, health care and professional services.					
G25 <b>Young, City Solos - Urban Edge</b>	2,543	3.9%	An eclectic mix of never-married singles living in vibrant downtown neighborhoods. Mostly young city dwellers between 25 and 45 years old with college degrees, working in a wide variety of occupations: business, education, science, sales, healthcare and the creative arts. A tradition of being home to beatniks, flower children, gays and public-interest crusaders. Predominantly white singles looking to enjoy a hip and active life before settling down.					
S71 <b>Economic Challenges - Tough Times</b>	2,296	3.5%	Bottom of the socioeconomic ladder, an underclass of the working poor and destitute seniors without family support. Nearly 75% are between the 50 and 75, 66% are single, divorced or widowed. Diverse community, with about 40% of households African-American, with solid concentrations of Hispanics and Asians. Nearly half of household heads never graduated from high school. Typically jobs as service-sector workers in education and public administration.					
E19 <b>Thriving Boomers - Full Pockets, Empty Nests</b>	2,294	3.5%	Upper middle-class and those near retirement, a mix of childless couples and singles as well as divorced and widowed. Mainly between 51 and 65, with 25% of retirement age. Nearly half contain someone with a graduate degree. A majority still work, holding senior positions in white-collar professional and technical services, but more than 20% are retired. In established neighborhoods, households predominantly white with an above-average presence of Asians.					
R67 <b>Aspirational Fusion - Hope for Tomorrow</b>	1,813	2.8%	Downscale segment concentrated in the nation's second-tier cities. Overwhelmingly black and nearly 90% single, these households consist mostly of single parents struggling to raise relatively young children on low incomes. More than 40% are under the age of 35, with half not completing high school, less than 5% having a college degree. Nearly 66% work at sales and service-sector jobs, typically in food preparation, protective services and educational services.					
G24 <b>Young, City Solos - Status Seeking Singles</b>	1,723	2.7%	A collection of young, upwardly mobile singles living in comfortable homes and condos. Mostly between the ages of 30 and 45, these unattached Americans are predominantly white with an above-average presence of Asians. A majority have college degrees and many have advanced degrees, working in white-collar jobs in technology, education, business and public administration. 80% of the households are filled with childless singles.
